VS/2009/0533 Learning for change – setting up learning networks under the ESF 2007-2013 announced by the European Commission / DG Employment, Social Affairs and Equal Opportunities

1. Background

The network established by 5 core partner countries: Poland, the Lombardy Region, Czech Republic, Flanders, Sweden enables the exchange of experiences and points of view as well as the discussion at European level between these countries which have already implemented a clear policy towards the social economy sector and the beginners in this field. Our purpose within the Network is to focus also on the instruments, which known and widespread in the advanced countries, need to be elaborated and improved. Therefore, our intention is to give the Member States more experienced the chance to become more professional in the subject. Furthermore, we see this Network as an opportunity to try to develop some common solutions, recommendations and tools at European Union level, which, thanks to the wide participation of the representatives of the Member States, could take into account different stands and opinions.

The Managing Authorities as well as other participants cooperating within the Network on social economy want to contribute to the Lisbon strategy through job-creation, social inclusion, increasing entrepreneurship, strengthening public administration and stimulating social innovation. The Regulation No 1081/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council indicates the important role of the social economy in social inclusion as well as supporting the development of social cooperatives. In consequence the support for this sector was included in different ESF operational programmes (OPs). The actions undertaken within the Network will meet the activities and instruments financed within OPs which will enhance and improve the development of social economy sector.

The Network will be **based on the experiences gained in the past six years within Equal** and other programmes / initiatives which gave Managing Authorities, Intermediate Bodies, National Support Structures, public authorities, project partners and experts the possibility to share knowledge and best practices and develop tools and policy recommendations as support

for social economy and social enterprises. The close link with the previous activities will be ensured by the members of the Network – the people that were involved in the European Thematic Group on Social Economy (2000-2006) form the founding fathers and core partners of the new Network. Our objective is to: (1) collect knowledge and best practices already existing, (2) organise them, (3) improve the solutions and work out new ones and (4) make them more visible and used.

The Network works on solutions for social economy in **five working groups focused on**:

- 1. Community law and social services of general interest in the light of social inclusion,
- 2. Measuring social added value and quality standards,
- 3. Social responsible public procurement and public social partnership in the context of social economy development,
- 4. Social franchising,
- 5. Financial instruments and mechanisms of fund's allocation to social economy.

The themes chosen reflect the need for supporting social enterprises at their start-up stage as well as their growth and development. They are closely linked and together form a comprehensive support addressed to social enterprises.

Through the Network its members will gain the possibility to:

- share information, participate in the discussion at wider level, exchange experiences,
- implement good practices in their ESF OPs,
- work out a new instrument on measuring social added value,
- increase the effectiveness, the quality and the transparency of social inclusion measures,
- increase their knowledge and skills,
- enhance their professional networks,
- influence public authorities at European, national, regional and local level.

The duration of the Network supported within VS/2009/0533 is 33 month (1.10.2009-30.06.2012).

The supporting materials will be posted on the website Facilitation of the meeting: The facilitators will be briefed to ensure a common, unified approach that works towards the same learning outcomes. Another key aspect of the facilitation will be drawing out conclusions and messages. It will be up to the facilitators to make use of the reflective session at the end of each working group discussion and the final closing session to pull all the debate into a series of key points. 3. Facilitator's tasks

This announcement refers to the period June - December 2011

- > Coordination of the Strand leaders` efforts
- Exploring policy areas identified for social economy development on the EU level
- ➤ Contributing to five reports based on the findings of thematic working groups and meeting discussions
- > Preparation of monthly draft reports concerning the Network progress
- ➤ Participating and providing an expert support at 5 events at least organized by working groups (workshops, peer reviews, seminars)
- ➤ Participating and providing expert support at the common network events like common network seminar on creating and testing a set of solutions and final learning seminar
- ➤ Participating in Steering Management Committees meetings
- Animating discussions and supporting website development

4. Expert profile

The qualifications of applying expert should be outlined in a comprehensive CV showing the professional achievements and providing previous experience in a social economy field. The CV should be also provided with a list of relevant reference projects concerning either 'exchange of knowledge' initiatives or participation in the EU actions, especially ESF projects. Each candidate should deliver a statement of availability confirming that he or she is available to perform requested tasks with indicated resource estimation in days.

The application should also include a one page information on how expertise will fit into NBFSE activities.

The maximum budget earmarked for the facilitation is **EUR 9 000 including overheads**. This sum does not include transportation and accommodation costs, which will be paid upon actual costs incurred. The claimed costs have to be in line with 'Financial Guidelines', which are available under the address:

The costs will be reimbursed according to the statement of the costs actually incurred and delivered invoices.

The budget has to be broken down by working days and appropriate time sheets should be provided to the contractor.

Requested qualification in details:

Qualifications and skills

• At least university degree education in associated field.

General professional experience

• At least 5 years experience in the area of social economy or third sector and preferably knowledge exchange in the EU and abroad.

Specific professional experience

- Experience in co-ordination and knowledge-exchange processes of programmes and projects concerning social development
- Experience in analyzing/ evaluation of projects/programmes on the social aspects of the labour market policy (social integration in employment)
- Detailed knowledge of the European Structural Funds, especially European Social Fund and previous EU-based programmes on social economy development, like Community Initiative EQUAL
- Knowledge on social, economic and labour market policies on the European level, particularly the issues concerning social economy development, like state aid, publicsocial partnership, public procurement, financial instruments and allocation of funds for social economy, social added value, social franchising

Language skills

- Fluency in English language, both spoken and written.
- Fluency in one or two other official EU language is an advantage.

4. Timing

The facilitator's work should start on 1 June 2011 and be finalized by 31 December 2011. The facilitator should be prepared to participate in all strand events (approximately six), common network seminars (approximately 2) and Steering Management Committee/Content Management meeting. The draft report from the event should be delivered within 15 days after the meeting.

- Peer review on financial instruments and mechanisms of funds allocation to social economy (the Czech Republic)

- A common seminar where the results of the strands` work are reported and discussed (Brussels, Lombardy Region, Warsaw – to be confirmed, September 2011)
- Final learning seminar addressed at all strands stakeholders, practitioners and experts involved in the network operation (Warsaw, December 2011)
